Columns (Description of the column content):

- Column 1 - University: Name of the University member of the Alliance
- Column 2 - Acronym of the alliance: The acronym of the alliance is the abbreviation formed by the initials of the words that make up the full name of the alliance. For example, if the alliance is called "European University Alliance for Innovation," the acronym could be "EUAI."
- Column 3 - Country: Country in which the University is located
- Column 4 - Generation: In the context of European University Alliances, "generations" typically refer to different cohorts or rounds of alliances that have been established as part of initiatives by the European Commission to foster collaboration and innovation in higher education across Europe.

These generations are characterized by distinct groups of alliances formed during different periods and under varying frameworks or programs. The European Commission's European Universities Initiative has launched several calls for proposals, each resulting in the selection and funding of a new generation of European University Alliances. At this moment we've arrived to the fourth generation.

- Column 5 - Geographic Coordinates: Coordinates of the location of the University.
- Column 6 - Alliance website URL. official website of the alliance of which the University is partner
